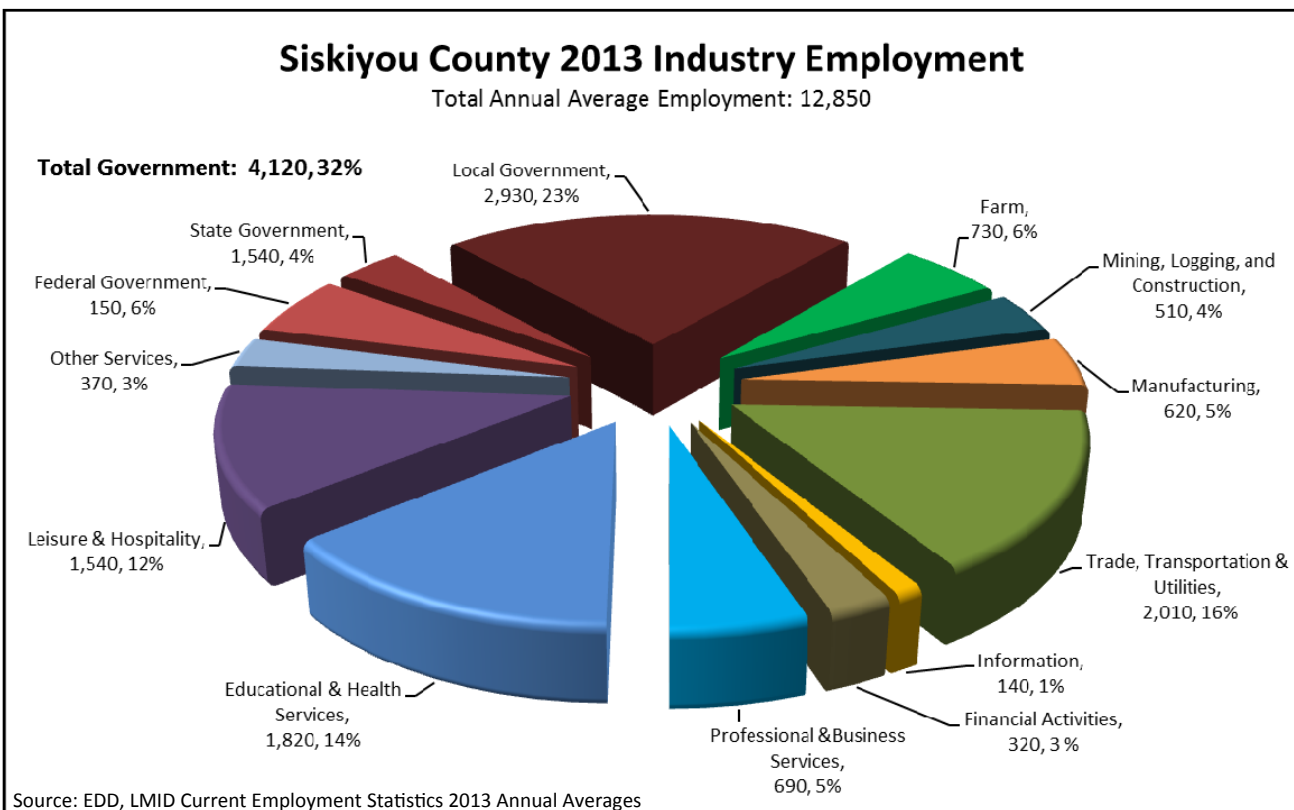

## Industry Employment



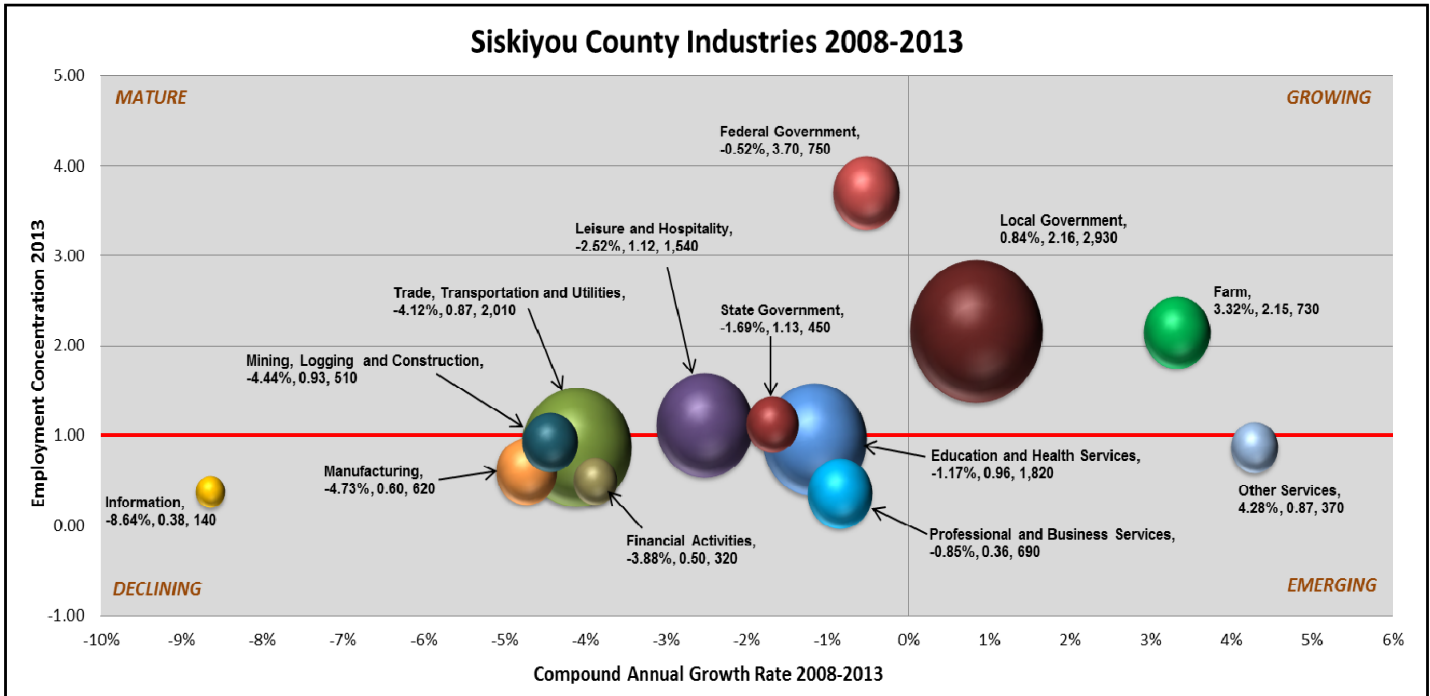
## Industry Highlights

- ▶ Siskiyou County's total annual average employment in 2013 was 12,850 jobs.
- ▶ Government was the largest industry, with 4,120 jobs, or 32 percent of total employment. Local Government accounted for the largest portion of Government employment with 2,930

- ▶ Trade, Transportation and Utilities was the second largest industry, with 2,010 jobs, consisting of 16 percent of total employment. In addition, Educational and Health Services recorded 1,820 jobs.
- ▶ Meanwhile, Leisure and Hospitality reported 1,540 jobs.

### Interpreting the chart:

- The size of the bubble indicates the employment size (number of jobs).
- The horizontal axis indicates the annual growth rate, or employment change, over the study period. Growth to the right on the graph is positive.
- The vertical axis indicates the concentration of an industry relative to the State. A concentration of 1.0 or higher indicates that the industry is more concentrated in the region than in the State.
- Industries in the right, upper quadrant show growth over the last five years and a higher concentration in the region compared to California.

## Industry Study Highlights

▶ An employment concentration higher than 1.0 indicates a region's competitive advantage and an area of specialized economic activity compared to the State. Regional industries that showed an employment concentration of 1.25 or higher are considered heavily concentrated compared to California. In Siskiyou County, Federal Government led the industry sectors with a concentration level of 3.70, Local Government was at 2.16, and Farm was at 2.15.

▶ Local Government and Farm are both considered growing industries due to their significant employment concentrations and annual job growth.

▶ Despite the decline in annual employment, Federal and State Government, and Leisure and Hospitality were considered mature due to their employment concentrations above 1.0.
