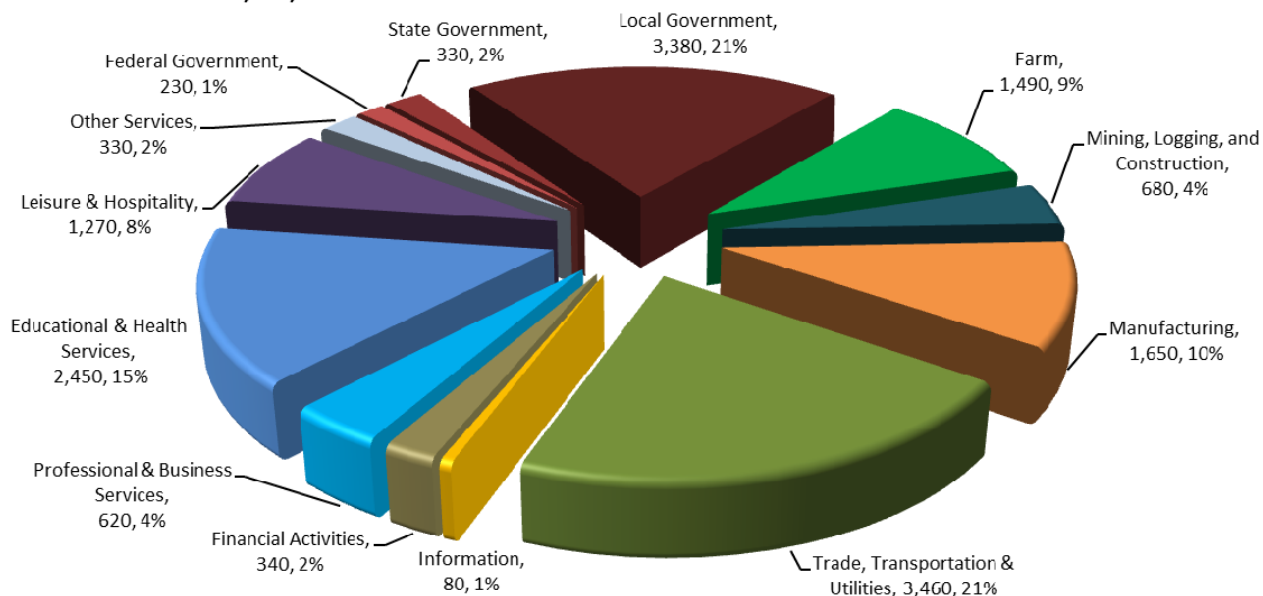

## Industry Highlights

Tehama County's total annual average employment in 2013 was 16,300 jobs.

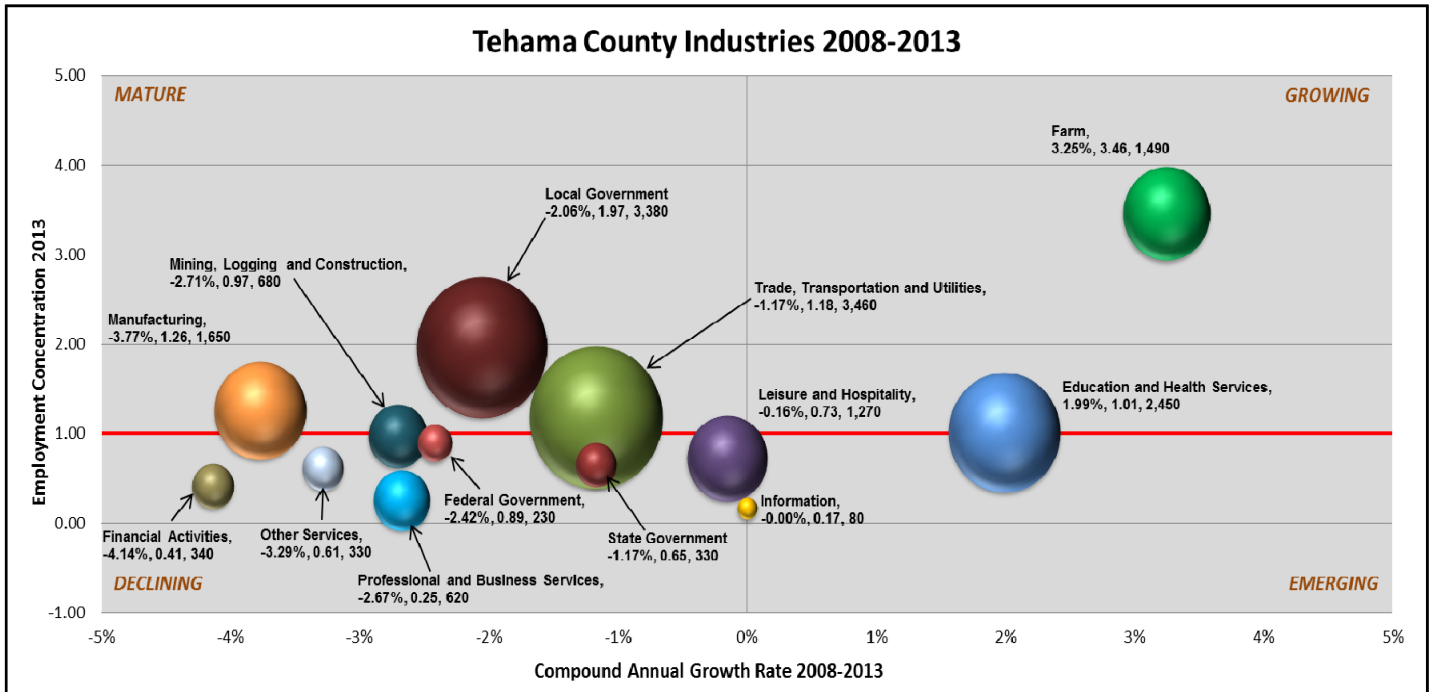
Government was the largest industry, with 3,940 jobs, or 24 percent of total employment. Local Government accounted for the largest portion of Government employment with 3,380 jobs.

Trade, Transportation and Utilities was the second largest industry, with 3,460 jobs, consisting of 21 percent of total employment. While, Educational and Health Services recorded 2,450 jobs.

Manufacturing reported 1,650 jobs, comprising of 10 percent of total employment.

### Interpreting the chart:

- The size of the bubble indicates the employment size (number of jobs).
- The horizontal axis indicates the annual growth rate, or employment change, over the study period. Growth to the right on the graph is positive.
- The vertical axis indicates the concentration of an industry relative to the State. A concentration of 1.0 or higher indicates that the industry is more concentrated in the region than in the State.
- Industries in the right, upper quadrant show growth over the last five years and a higher concentration in the region compared to California.

## Industry Study Highlights

▶ An employment concentration higher than 1.0 indicates a region's competitive advantage and an area of specialized economic activity compared to the State. Regional industries that showed an employment concentration of 1.25 or higher are considered heavily concentrated compared to California. In Tehama County, Farm led the industry sectors with a concentration level of 3.46, Local Government was at 1.97, and Manufacturing was at 1.26.

▶ Farm and Education and Health Services are both industry sectors considered growing due to their significant employment concentrations and annual job growth.

▶ Local Government, Manufacturing, and Trade, Transportation and Utilities lost employment during the study period despite reporting an employment concentration greater than 1.0 and are considered mature industries.
